22nd Annual Bowl-to-Benefit The Umbrella



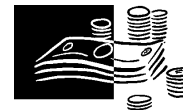

You can reduce your risk of a heart attack and/or stroke by becoming aware of your risk factors, the personal characteristics and habits that may increase your chances of an event. Some you can't change or control, some you can by changing your daily habits or taking medicine as prescribed.

Use the quiz on this page to learn where to focus your efforts to reduce your risk. Then work with your health care provider to reduce, control or prevent as many risk factors as you can. You will be glad you did and so will your family.

CHECK ALL BOXES THAT APPLY

If you check two or more boxes, see a healthcare provider for a complete assessment of your risks!

AGE & SEX. A man over 45 yrs old OR a woman over 55 yrs. old.

FAMILY HISTORY. Father or brother had a heart attack before age 55; OR mother or sister had one before age 65; OR mother, father, sister, brother or grandparent had a stroke.

HEART DISEASE MEDICAL HISTORY. Have coronary heart disease, atrial fibrillation or another heart condition OR had a heart attack.

STROKE MEDICAL HISTORY. Have carotid artery disease; OR had a stroke or TIA (transient ischemic attack); OR have a disease of the leg arteries, a high red blood cell count or sickle cell anemia.

BLOOD PRESSURE. Blood pressure is 140/90mm Hg or higher, OR a health professional has said blood pressure is too high, OR don't know what blood pressure is.

TOBACCO SMOKE. Smoke OR live or work with people who smoke regularly.

TOTAL CHOLESTEROL is 240mg/dL or higher, OR don't know level.

HDL CHOLESTEROL HDL (good) cholesterol is less than 40 mg/dL OR don't know HDL cholesterol level.

The One Great Hour of Sharing (OGHS) offering, administered by Wider Church Ministries, is the refugee, relief and development fund of the United Church of Christ. It provides support to people in more than eighty countries: in hurricane ravaged communities along the U. S. Gulf Coast helping people rebuild their

homes; in the Dominican Republic , helping families learn how best to grow and sell the fruits of their labor; in Colombia, teaching families to grow their food in greenhouses and raise their chickens in nurseries to avoid aerial fumigations which target illegal crops and harm produce and contaminate the soil; in Chaco, South America supporting native peoples in learning sustainable agriculture; in the Democratic Republic of Congo, providing food, water, and sanitation to people displaced by fighting; in Zimbabwe, providing emergency food aid and the tools to grow food due to a complex humanitarian crisis; in Darfur, Sudan working to prevent disease among displaced people by teaching better hygiene and the importance of clean water; in Gaza providing food, clean water, medical care and psychological support in a region of cultural and political instability; in Belgrade, Serbia, helping parents start micro-businesses and attend adult education courses; in Afghanistan, supporting rehabilitation centers helping children overcome the trauma of war; in India rebuilding permanent homes and multi-purpose disaster shelters/community meeting centers after a tsunami; and in Indonesia, supporting agricultural endeavors after a tsunami.
